

Ongoing Clergy Formation

As with all of us, the ongoing development of priests never ends. Formation for clergy in our diocese is led by Mgr Kevin McGinnell. Formation is focused on the four areas of spiritual, intellectual, pastoral and human development. In 2024 and 2025 a full programme of clergy formation has been designed. The programme is a mixture of scriptural. theological and canonical studies, homiletics, prayer and retreats.

Men preparing for the priesthood through discernment activities and studies usually spend 6-7 years in seminary.

Our diocese is blessed with three men in seminary at present. Our seminarians have shown prayerful dedication to being witnesses of the Gospel through the sacrifice of giving their lives to God.

It costs approximately £30,000 each year for a man to attend seminary.



Is your child crying during Mass?

Very small children—infants and toddlers—are quite capable of making a great deal of noise, but they generally do so for some reason: because they are uncomfortable, hungry, or tired, for example. If they are making a noise, it may be possible to quiet them there and then, but very often a parent will have to take them outside: not just for the sake of other people, but to meet the child's needs.

In our churches there are areas where you can take your child. Saint Paul's: back room with glass panelling.

Saint Thomas': Meeting Room.

Most Holy Name's: former sacristy. Standing outside a church with a small child is, after all, a way of serving God, and you are "morally present" at Mass as far as meeting your own obligation to attend is concerned. Soft toys should be preferred to be brought into the church.

You're Needed...!

Helpers are needed to help as Sacristan, readers, cleaners and to count the offertory after Mass on Sunday.
