# **PARISH NOTICES**



In this third week of advent, you will notice that the colour of the candle is different to the usual purple. It is a rose coloured candle symbolising Gaudete Sunday. 'Gaudete, Christus est natus', 'Rejoice! that Christ is born'.

Joy is a gift from God, we recognise that. We are mindful of the many times we have tried to manufacture joy. But the Prophet Isaiah gives us a picture of joy when he speaks of what the Lord will do, how the Lord will bring new life to the wasteland.

They will come to Zion, shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces. Joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended. It is important that we appreciate that this is a gift from the Lord, and it is in response to what God has done. How often we find ourselves looking quite sorry for ourselves even in church. No wonder our Holy Father invites us not to look like sourpusses. We can be easily distracted from the heart of the Kerygma, the Gospel that God who created us and took compassion upon us when we were fallen into sin, has sent a Saviour and that Saviour has come with a promise of the spirit to those who are open to receiving the gifts of God. That is a great message of joy.

I always remember hearing where the word Kerygma came from. Apparently, a slave would be chosen by a general, to return to Rome with the message in his hand that the battle had been won. He did so gladly and rejoicing because he knew that once the message was delivered the emperor would grant him his freedom. Maybe we need to see joy in those terms. Our joy is given to us when we appreciate what we have received from the Lord and nothing can take away from that experience of joy. So we have thought about hope and we have thought about peace, and in so many ways this week in thinking about joy, we are reminding ourselves that God's work is fruitful and that we can indeed rejoice.

# **DIOCESAN NOTICES**

# "Safeguarding is rightly at the heart of or mission"

Safeguarding in our community is the responsibility of us all. If you are concerned about the welfare of a child or adult at risk, do not delay in contacting the police, using 999 if a child or adult is believed to be in immediate danger.

It is the policy of the Catholic Church in England and Wales to report all allegations of abuse to statutory authorities, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the accused person is living or deceased. If you are in any role within our Church, you must refer allegations directly to our diocesan safeguarding office, or directly to the Police.

Every human being has a value and dignity which we as Catholics acknowledge as coming directly from God's creation of male and female in his own image and likeness. We believe therefore that all people should be valued, supported and protected from harm.

In the Catholic Church this is demonstrated by the provision of carefully planned activities for children, young people and adults; supporting families under stress; caring for those hurt by abuse in the past; ministering to and managing those who have caused harm.

It is because of these varied ministries that we need to take all reasonable steps to provide a safe environment for all which promotes and supports their wellbeing. This will include carefully selecting and appointing those who work with children, young people or adults at risk and responding robustly where concern arises.

## A huge thank you from your St Vincent de Paul (SVP) Conference

The SVP team would like to extend a huge "thank you" for the generosity shown within our parish for the money donated during the second collections at Mass before Christmas – this exceeded last year and will help us to support families in need in our area.


Thank you also for the generous Christmas gifts donated by our three parishes, the response has been overwhelming and this has helped us to give presents to dozens of children and families in need at Christmas time.

The past year has been even busier for the SVP, and we saw a steep rise in the number of families needing support and struggling with the cost-of-living crisis across our region.

Our team of volunteers has been able to support several families this year from securing grants to help with their winter fuel and food payments, to providing household items such as beds, wardrobes, furniture, and white goods, in addition to our ongoing befriending visits. We also set up and delivered basic and intermediate English lessons to Ukraine families in Oundle, and supported group trauma counselling initiatives for Ukraine refugee families in Kettering.

Further afield, our SVP conference supported the purchase of 5 milking cows for a village in rural Kerela, India which is in an area twinned with our Conference here. The primary school children at St Thomas More, Kettering were amazing and helped us raise the money through their "singathon" in the summer. We were also able to sponsor a mature student to undertake a 4-year Batchelor in Nursing course in Thanjavur, India as well as purchasing school uniforms for 10 primary school children in Kerala to enable them to start their schooling.

We thank you all for your kindness and generosity, and for your support and prayers for our continued work in the SVP.

# Is your child crying during Mass?

Very small children—infants and toddlers—are quite capable of making a great deal of noise, but they generally do so for some reason: because they are uncomfortable, hungry, or tired, for example. If they are making a noise, it may be possible to quiet them there and then, but very often a parent will have to take them outside: not just for the sake of other people, but to meet the child's needs.

In our churches there are areas where you can take your child.

Saint Paul's: back room with glass panelling.

Saint Thomas': Meeting Room. Most Holy Name's: former sacristy.

Standing outside a church with a small child is, after all, a way of serving God, and you are "morally present" at Mass as far as meeting your own obligation to attend is concerned.

Soft toys should be preferred to be brought into the church.

Helpers are needed to help as Sacristan, readers, cleaners and to count the offertory after Mass on Sunday.
