CAFOD Family Fast Day appeal – Harvest Collection at Masses on Sun 8th October

Have you ever had to rush to hospital or take a sick child or family member? How did you feel? Stressed, vulnerable, fearful even. But perhaps you also remember the doctor you met, feelings of gratitude and relief that medical help was on hand. But what if our homes were flooded, our children were sick, and we needed help to come to us? I want to tell you about Dr Nasha's Mobile Clinic. Dr Nasha's Mobile Clinic gets her and her team of doctors and nurses where they're needed — fast. Last year, when flooding hit Pakistan, the team travelled across hundreds of miles to treat people who needed medical help in the aftermath of the disaster. That's how they met Meera. Meera gave birth just as her home was destroyed by the floods. The family moved into a temporary shelter at the side of the road. And with little food and nothing but contaminated water to drink, diseases started to spread throughout the camp. Meera told us: "Our children got sick, and we had no medicines." When Dr Nasha and her team arrived in her village, Meera hurried to bring her children to the clinic and got them the life-saving medicines and treatment they needed. Meera's baby, Marwi, is now a healthy one year old. Together, she and her husband have rebuilt their home and are working to recover what they lost in the floods.

Your gift to CAFOD will mean families like Meera's can get help from doctors and other local experts when they need it most. With extreme disasters like flooding happening more and more, the support of monthly gifts is needed now more than ever.


An Advent journey with John the Baptist


GIFT AID ENVELOPES

Is your child crying during Mass?

Very small children—infants and toddlers—are quite capable of making a great deal of noise, but they generally do so for some reason: because they are uncomfortable, hungry, or tired, for example. If they are making a noise, it may be possible to quiet them there and then, but very often a parent will have to take them outside: not just for the sake of other people, but to meet the child's needs.

In our churches there are areas where you can take your child.

Saint Paul's: back room with glass panelling.

Saint Thomas': Meeting Room.

Most Holy Name's: former sacristy.

Standing outside a church with a small child is, after all, a way of serving God, and you are "morally present" at Mass as far as meeting your own obligation to attend is concerned.

Soft toys should be preferred to be brought into the church.
